we took to Chattanooga 3 years ago, has a "book club" of 50 peers mostly humanities students. He invited me to speak at the **University** and picked the title "**should we stay or should we go?**". Practically all of the students in southern Italy can't wait to graduate and migrate to other parts of Europe or overseas.



Salvatore asked me to share my experience and forewarned me about any spiritual aspect of the talk since the majority of the audience was agnostic at best. The Lord had a different plan as many of the students were discussing the chance to have a "new birth or rebirth" to get rid of the stigma or framing that has been put on them already. Obviously that gave me the perfect platform to share some of the biblical accounts of true rebirth. What blew me away was the comment of **Barbara**, an **atheist**, who told my friend Salvatore after the meeting that she felt for a moment she was *touched by something much bigger than herself* almost as if **God decided to show up in the room** with us! What an awesome account. Those

guys accompanied me to my car in a distant parking lot after giving me a tour of the campus. It felt as if in an instant I adopted a bunch of sons and daughters. **Their display of warmth and love went beyond the norm, spurred by a desire of intimate fellowship!** Three weeks ago two dear saints came to visit from the States and had the chance to experience some of this with a small group of these students. They too confirmed there is something there that needs to be nurtured. Mid June a cousin from America got married in a the beautiful castle on the Italian Riviera. What was even more stunning was how the Lord orchestrated a **divine appointment** with a friend from our Rome Bible study who **"happened"** to be in Portofino at the same time and invited us to meet her at the **Pirelli's villa** where she was hosted. We thus



met some of the family and had a **chance to talk about His greatness** and our
