Christ reminds me that I am to love the unlovable less I show that I know nothing about His nature nor His teachings and therefore have no platform for ministry anywhere. Developing a compassionate heart (like His) for the arrogant, stubborn, selfish, rude people of Rome is still my biggest challenge. I think this afflicts all of us no matter where we live. We have been given mercy, we ought to show mercy. The other day I was driving to an exclusive Hotel for a follow up appointment and an impatient scooter was honking behind me though he had room to pass. Once at the intersection (which incidentally was the one in front of my destination in Via Veneto), the rider came along the side of the car and yelled: "why don't you get off the road", to which I replied "why don't you get lost". He then "invited me" to get out of the car (oh boy...I would have loved to...), but I told him I had no time to waste with an imbecile like him. By this time we got the attention of the pedestrians since our decibels got higher. A taxi pulled up and a fellow, like the one I was to meet, came out and caught the tail end of the scene. Conviction set in"Peppo, here you are yelling to this guy on the scooter and in a few minutes you want to talk about... the love of
