I am somewhat surprised we lasted 3 years (3 times the average life of a missionary in Italy) in Roma.

Missing the ministry in Palm Beach, giving up Marco to school in Germany and seeing Isabella struggle in the Italian school system have been **big blows**. Yet, our Lord reminds us to pick up the cross daily, and I have to say that He has provided a "blessed environment" for us despite the challenges. As I look around at believing friends that are afflicted by sickness, separations, emotional distress, I ponder what difference do we make -or- how do we differ from those "in the world" that are afflicted by the same ailments? Do we walk in misery feeling the crushing weight of the burden on our shoulders? Do we feel empty having been devoid of the joy of the Lord? Do we lament the agony that seems to accompany our dark days? Yes, we heard about the footstep in the sand....cute, but the wounds do not get healed with fairy tales imagery; we know all the scriptures about overcoming, doing everything through His power, not being alone in the midst of the trials and so on, but how do we ACT? Do we really KNOW and trust His leading? Do we truly believe that ultimately He has the best in mind for our lives? I am afraid most of us still have a long ways to go on the "behavioral" side which is a reflection of our true creed and not just a confession of what we believe.

Currently we are guests of one of our disciples in

the beautiful island of Sardegna. I thank God every morning for the fantastic creation that seems to abound in this place. It is not by chance that I feel this way having one of the most spectacular seas in the world at 300 yards from the house! But why do I tell you this. Now most of you will drop support seeing that I am still stuck on fishing fish instead of men while on vacation....! I just wanted to make a point with what I was describing earlier. How much are we in love with the One that gave everything for us? 15 minutes versus 5 hours of personal pleasure? Do not want to be legalistic, just confessing my shortcomings here and spurring myself and those of you that relate, to "invest" our time wisely where the returns will be best maximized!
